OVERVIEW

Longleaf School of the Arts is a public, college-preparatory school integrating academics with fine and performing arts. All students are encouraged to pursue the most rigorous coursework, explore new art forms and deepen artistic skills. The first Senior Class graduated in 2016.

Course Load: Students take 7 year-long courses

CURRICULUM

Longleaf seeks to develop students who will make connections across disciplines to solve real world problems. To this end, Longleaf not only requires 6 Arts elective credits, but also a credit in Cognitive Development. Longleaf offers **44 Honors** classes and **17 Advanced Placement** classes. Students are typically not recommended for AP courses until Junior Year.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Students must successfully complete a minimum of 27 credits in grades 9-12 (1 credit = 1 year):

2 Additional Electives (may include Art)

ARTS ENDORSEMENT

In addition to the 6 required Arts credits, students may choose to pursue an Arts Endorsement or advanced concentration in an area of the arts. Endorsements require at least 7 credits, including a history course in the chosen endorsement, and a progression to advanced and special topics courses.
