Music & Psychology

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Maestro Alexander Alberti holds the position of Director of Instrumental Music and Psychology at Longleaf. At LSA, Alberti teaches a wide variety of music courses, including concert band, wind ensemble, orchestra, contemporary a cappella, AP Music Theory, music history, AP Psychology, and jazz.

In addition to teaching music at Longleaf, he also works with the Middle Creek High School marching band in Apex, North Carolina, teaching front ensemble and percussion. Alberti has served as a conductor for Company Carolina and the Pauper Players at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Alberti formerly taught at Southern Lee High School in Sanford, where he taught music theory, band, orchestra, and chorus, as well as their first ever a cappella program, The Cavalryrics.

Mr. Alberti is currently enrolled at the University of North Carolina at Greensboro, pursuing a Master's degree in Music Education. He is an alumnus of Appalachian State University, where he holds a Bachelor of Music in Music Education and a minor in Psychology. At Appalachian State, he participated in the ASU Men's Glee Club, wind ensemble, concert band, symphonic band, orchestra, and served as a music theory tutor for the entire sequence of music theory and aural skills courses. Alberti is an active researcher in the field of music, with interests ranging from theory pedagogy, a cappella, music psychology, and music education. Alberti has presented his findings with NAFME, the College Music Society, and the National Conference of Undergraduate Research.

In his spare time, Alberti composes both choral and instrumental works, judges for the International Competition for Collegiate A Cappella, and participates in the semi-professional a cappella group, Spectrum Vocals.
